

# Ohio Divorce Law

## Defendants Need to Know

Ohio legislators were interested in making sure that one spouse could not force a no-fault divorce on the family (Jan. 10, 1974). A spouse thinking about no-fault divorce could be helped by marriage-friendly therapists or spiritual advisors.

- In Ohio, marital abandonment is a first degree misdemeanor. Someone that aids, abets, conspires with, or causes another to commit an offense can be charged with committing complicity (ORC 2919.21, 2923.03).
- A spouse can still get financial help and labor from the other spouse by asking for reimbursements for necessities, instead of filing for divorce or separation (3103.03).
- Incompatibility, if denied, cannot be used as ground for divorce (3105.01 K).
