(Amended Senate Bill No. 348)

AN ACT

To amend section 3105.01 of the Revised Code to include living apart without cohabitation for an uninterrupted period of two years as a ground for divorce.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That section 3105.01 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3105.01. The court of common pleas may grant divorces for the following causes:

- (A) Either party had a husband or wife living at the time of the marriage from which the divorce is sought;
 - (B) Willful absence of the adverse party for one year;
 - (C) Adultery;
 - (D) Impotency;
 - (E) Extreme cruelty;
 - (F) Fraudulent contract;
 - (G) Any gross neglect of duty;
 - (H) Habitual drunkenness;
- (I) Imprisonment of the adverse party in a state or federal penal institution under sentence thereto at the time of filing the petition;

(J) Procurement of a divorce without this state, by a husband or wife, by virtue of which the party who procured it is released from the obligations of the marriage, while such obligations remain binding upon the other party;

(K) ON THE APPLICATION OF EITHER PARTY, WHEN HUSBAND AND WIFE HAVE, WITHOUT INTERRUPTION FOR TWO YEARS, LIVED SEPARATE AND APART WITHOUT COHABITATION. A PLEA OF RES JUDICATA OR OF RECRIMINATION WITH RESPECT TO ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT BAR EITHER PARTY FROM OBTAINING A DIVORCE ON THIS GROUND.

SECTION 2. That existing section 3105.01 of the Rev Code is hereby repealed.	ised
